The 2021 Canadian Quarter Horse Association (CQHA) board of directors focused on building capacity to position and promote the quality of Canadian quarter horse breeding programs, quality of trainers, and training programs and the domestic and international results those programs have produced..

Working to address the priorities identified by the CQHA members at the last AGM – our board has been working toward expanding the CQHA footprint in the whole of the Quarter Horse Industry.


·I want to applaud the dedication of the CQHA Board and CQHA members who committed and participated to the Board meetings and the work on the different committees.

I direct your attention to the attendance report for the CQHA Board members. (See appendix A) CQHA Board members like Melanie Burns and Brad Bowie have been active first responders and front-line workers during the pandemic and have remained dedicated and engaged with CQHA.

Special mention should also be made to the many CQHA members who volunteered their time this past year on committees and at major Canadian and American events, presenting CQHA awards, promoting CQHA programs, and interviewing Canadians to highlight the value of our industry.

KEY RESULTS AND ACTIVITIES

- CQHA presence online and in the Canadian Quarter Horse community increased significantly during is the past year. I wanted to signal out the efforts of the Media, Marketing and Communication Committee and CQHA's Media Team under the leadership of Laurie Haughton.
 - Consider the following results statistics: a.526 new eNews letter subscribers.
 - b.CQHA membership increase of over 400% from previous years.
 - c.Instagram post reach up from 69K to 207k users compared to 2020 (inaugural year).
 - d. Facebook reach above 24,000 users a week.
 - e.Key foreign followers include: United States, Brazil, UK, Australia, Austria, Italy, Mexico, and Belgium.
 - f.Creation of a social media guide for the Canadian provincial AQHA affiliates.



- Gayle Pawley-Wilson once again accomplished great work and engaged with all the AQHA provincial affiliates. The CQHA/AQHA Grants Program supported multiple key Canadian and breeders' events such Alberta Quarter Horse Racing Association's Canadian Cup yearling sale. The Ontario, Quebec and Alberta breeders' futurities, and numerous non AQHA events that showcased the breed.
- The Covernance Committee under the leadership of Wayne Burwash revised CQHA's Bylaws - they should be discussed and approved by the CQHA membership at a Special Meeting in March hosted with the Manitoba along with AQHA Summit.
- Continued work with Equestrian Canada and Cheval Quebec focused on:
 - a.obtaining a follow-up grant to address promotion and marketing initiatives domestically and abroad.
 - b. working on developing incentive fund based on best practices for Canada's Quarter Horse marketplace.
- Shift on approach regarding sponsors to that of building partnerships provides win-win scenarios and value added approach. Thank you to Brad Bowie for his leadership of the Partnership Committee.
- CQHA promoted through social media and Canadian Horse Journal magazine, key Canadian achievements at prestigious events, such as All-American Quarter Horse Congress, Greatest Horseman competition, Run for a Million, Southern Belle Futurities, NSBA World Show, World Equestrian Championship show, and the 6 AQHA World Championship shows. CQHA conducted live interviews with Canadian trainers, exhibitors, and owners on social media during or after these events.
- The Breeders' Committee under the leadership of Michael Fureth accomplish a considerable amount of work. This included working with Equestrian Canada to develop a "white paper" to study the many incentive fund and futurity/ maturity models used in the horse industry at large. The establishment of breeders' section of the website, with parts still in the development stage ie:

- Canadian Stallion Station
- Canadian Breeders Directory
- Canadian owned/bred Classifieds
- Established Officials and Professional Development Committee chaired by CQHA member Debbie Haughton. They focused their energies on understating and expanding capabilities within Canada, promoting AQHA University and professional advancement opportunities for Canadians. In collaboration with the CQHA Grant Committee, AQHA and Canadian AQHA Pro Horseman Tara Gamble, they also launched a Canadian horse industry focused virtual business seminar, which was well supported by CQHA members and the Saskatchewan Horse Federation.
- Shannon Burwash Memorial Scholarship Fund awarded 3 scholarships to students pursing veterinary medicine and animal science related degrees.
- The Media, Marketing & Communications committee in association with the Awards, Breeders & Partnership committees, launched the CQHA Horse of Merit Award presented by ACE Therapy Canada, to recognize Canadian owned Quarter Horses aged 15 years and older still active in the industry. The inaugural recipients will be presented with commemorative medals at the 2022 AQHA Canadian Summit in Brandon Manitoba in March.
- CQHA Awards Committee revised the awards criteria and created distinction within the breeders category by specifying awards for:
 - Ranch Horse Breeder of the year,
 - Performance Horse of the Year and
 - Racehorse Breeder of the Year.
- AQHA announced their plans to host a 2022 Canadian focused International Summit in late August, since then the Special Events committee under the leadership of Larry Clifford has been busy co-coordinating logistics with AQHA and event site in Brandon, Manitoba. Larry has established a CQHA Task force to assist in creating and implementing the CQHA components of the event such as the 2022 CQHA Awards Ceremony.

COMMITTEES OF THE CQHA

- Governance Committee: (Chair: Wayne Burwash)- This
 Committee's role is to focus on the by-laws and governance
 elements of these by-laws, making recommendations for
 changes to CQHA BoD.
- Nominations Committee: (Past President: Wayne Burwash)) The role of this Committee is addressing the election and nominations of the new CQHA BoD.
- Finance Committee: (Chair: Mary Ellen Robinson) -This Committee's role is key to the overall management of the CQHA Finances. This Committee will oversee all of the financial components of the CQHA. The work of the Committee includes the planning, budgeting, tracking and reporting of the CQHA Finances. Financial Reports will be required quarterly and for the AGM. The Committee's duties will also include overseeing revenues that the CQHA generates through Affiliate Grant Program, the Equestrian Canada and Sponsorships programs or other revenue streams generated by CQHA programs. The Committee will prepare a budget for the CQHA, obtain approval from the CQHA Executive and BoD.
- Media, Marketing and Communications Committee: (Chair: Laurie Haughton) The role of the Media, Marketing & Communications Committee will be to provide strategic direction and leadership to the CQHA Media Team, Board of Directors, Committees, Membership & Alliances. This committee will work to promote the programs, activities & events presented and or supported by CQHA in partnership with AQHA, the AQHA Provincial Affiliates and CQHA's Industry Alliance Partners through electronic communications, the CQHA.ca website, and CQHA's social media platforms, and other means of communications in person, in print & digitally. The key objectives of the committee are to:
 - Communicate the purpose of the association in accordance with its mandate with the American Quarter Horse Association;
 - Facilitate the promotion of CQHA programs and activities;
 - Act as the national representative and spokes group of the largest breed population of the Canadian herd;
 - Address the concerns of Canadian owners of Registered American Ouarter Horses:
 - Promote Canadian bred and owned registered American Quarter Horses:
 - Uphold and communicate with respect and dignity the standards of equine welfare in Canada and in accordance with AQHA's position statement on the humane treatment of horses
- The Media, Marketing & Communications Committee sets out to meet the objectives stated above as they apply to all AQHA sanctioned events and non AQHA sanctioned events and activities.
- Special Events AGM-Task Force Committee: (Chair: Larry Clifford) This Committee is responsible for preparing, planning, budgeting, and implementing the CQHA AGM and any meeting of the general membership. Awards Committee: (Chair:) - This Committee is responsible for coordinating the implementation of the CQHA Awards Program. These awards are presented annually. The Committee is specifically responsible for preparing the budget and implementation plan of the CQHA AWARDS, including the communication plan work with the Media, Marketing & Communication Committee. The Committee will maximize existing COHA communication channels, preparing the CQHA Awards program application forms, evaluation criteria and recommending following the evaluation of the application a slate of award recipients to the COHA Executive. The Committee will prepare the presentation and ensure communication with the recipients. They will order the Award Buckles based on the results of their evaluation. They can also propose additional awards based on the analysis performed by the committee members. Prepare a report for the activities and outcomes achieved and present at the CQHA AGM.
- Shannon Burwash Memorial Scholarship Committee: (Chair: Marnie Somers) This Committee is responsible for the Administration of the Shannon Burwash Scholarship program.

- Breeders Committee: (Chair: Michael Fureth) Overall Purpose of Committee:
 - Position Canada nationally and internationally as a source of quality Quarter Horses, breeding programs, stallion standings, information pertaining to reproductive technology, and information on equine health and welfare.
 - Improve the image of Canadian bred Quarter Horses Nationally and Internationally
- AQHA Youth World Cup Committee: (Chair: Kathy Patterson) This
 Committee is responsible for the CQHA in relating more specifically to the
 AQHA Youth World Cup Committee, selection of Manager and Coach for
 the Youth team and preparing and submitting the budget for this activity.
 Financial reports of the activities of the Youth World Cup and the
 Committee tabled at the BoD and the CQHA AGM. The Committee is an
 essential promoter of Youth activities and programs across Canada
- Grant Committee: (Chair: Gayle Pawley-Wilson) The Objectives of the Grant Committee is to provide funding to encourage the expansion of the AQHA and CQHA membership, AQHA registrations, the marketing of the American Quarter Horse, the understanding and protection of the breed integrity as well as the discovery of the American Quarter Horse's many talents in Canada. Scope of Work:
 - The CQHA Grant Committee will review, edit, and distribute the CQHA Grant
 - Application Guidelines to the membership by CQHA Media and email annually after approval by the CQHA Board of Directors.
 - The CQHA Grant Committee will provide approved application information to the CQHA Marketing and Media Committee including dates, pictures, and participant lists.
 - CQHA Grant Committee will collect and submit all information (including applications, receipts, budget reports, post reports and AQHA member participant lists for each application) for reimbursement to AQHA by September 15 working with the CQHA Treasurer.
- Officials & Professional Development Committee: (Chair: Debbie Haughton) The role of the Show Officials & Professional Development Committee will be to support Canadian horse show officials, and those who professionally train and or show Quarter Horses, and coach riders, as well those who intent to peruse opportunities and credentials to become either. This committee will work to promote the programs, activities & events presented and or supported by CQHA in partnership with AQHA, the AQHA Provincial Affiliates and CQHA's Industry Alliance Partners through electronic communications, the CQHA.ca website, that promote Canadian talent as show officials, trainers and coaches, offer continuing education, skill advancement, and preparations for qualifying Canadians to apply for and test for national and international credentials.
- AQHA International Committee: (Chair:)
- Nomination & Credentials Committee: (Chair: Wayne Burwash) The general purpose of the Nomination Committee (the "Committee") on behalf of the CQHA is to:
 - Ensure there is an election each year with a rigorous nomination system;
 - Recruit qualified individuals to stand for election as directors;
 - Present a slate of candidates for the election of directors of CQHA in accordance with the
 - CQHA's Bylaws and the established nomination guidelines and procedure;
- Partnership Development Committee: (Co-Chairs: Brad Bowie & Gilles Seguin) This Committee is strategically vital to the financial sustainably of CQHA. The committee is responsible for identifying partners/sponsors, linking the partners to CQHA programs such as Awards and Grant program areas. It is responsible for CQHA Board members to build a cross Canada network to engage and obtain partnership / sponsorship support.

FINANCE COMMITTEE

CQHA has had a very active year, with all the challenges of Covid, but we still did very well and continue to pursue our goal of propagating the American Quarter Horse. There was a lot of flexibility in our business planning, fund allocations, and making sure we distributed funds fairly to all provinces as well as reaching a broad variation of disciplines. Our Grant Committee was active under the capable direction of Gayle Pawley- Wilson and was able to fund a great deal of programs. With shows limited, programs had to be adapted and monies allocated in unique ways – different than ever before.

Our continued AQHA funding was greatly appreciated as it was questioned at times whether we would continue to be funded as previously. The Federal Agricultural grant Gilles Seguin was able to secure through Equestrian Canada, also helped us to maintain our continued visibility. Sierra Kane, AQHA's International Director commented that CQHA did an excellent job with our budgeting, and management of AQHA's grant funds.

The CQHA Treasurer Mary Ellen Robinson, would like to thank our highly professional Accountant, Dawna Delainey, for her hard work and assistance this year. The CQHA books were submitted one week before year end (September 30th) and CQHA is about to have its approved statement back from the Canadian Revenue Agency. Her efficiency and support have been greatly appreciated. She has been a pleasure for all the Executive to work with. **See Appendix B for the full financials.**

2022 CQHA/ AQHA AWARD PROGRAM - BASED ON ACHIEVEMENT IN 2021

The CQHA Awards Committee reviewed the different awards categories, reviewed the criteria, focused, and introduce a new award: CQHA Performance Horse of the Year Award.

The nomination forms are available of the CQHA website and will awards will be presented at the CQHA Special Event held in conjunction with the AQHA Summit in March 2022 in Brandon Manitoba. Nominations are open until January 20, 2022.

The following Awards were approved by the COHA Board of Directors.

CQHA AWARDS DESCRIPTIONS

The Canadian Quarter Horse Association (CQHA) is a proud affiliate of the American Quarter Horse Association (AQHA) and is honored to offer recognition to the outstanding individuals who help promote the American Quarter Horse in Canada through breeding, training, or volunteering.

Overall Requirements:

- 1.Be AQHA members in good standing for a minimum of 5 years (other than the youth awards).
- 2..Be a current CQHA member.
- 3. Must be nominated. The nomination form can be found on the CQHA website.
- 4. Be accompanied by two letters of reference with contact information.
- 5. Must be a Canadian Resident and have their main operation in Canada.
- Horses that are nominated must be registered with AQHA.
- 7.CQHA/AQHA Awards winners will be eligible for renomination 5 years post winning.

BREEDER AWARDS

CQHA/AQHA Ranch Horse Breeder of the Year -

This award is aimed at engaging the mid size breeder that has and currently raises fine American Quarter horses.

CQHA/AQHA Performance Horse Breeder of

the Year - This award is aimed at those breeders that are already actively involved with AQHA, may not own many horses, but have a focus on raising horses that excel in AQHA competition. CQHA/AQHA Racing Breeder of the Year - This award emulates the American version at AQHA. The Applicant must own a minimum of five AQHA registered mares used to produce racing QH horses and must breed and register at least five foals annually.The Racing Award is for operations that raise American Quarter Horses for use of Racing.

TRAINER AWARD

CQHA Trainer of the year - This award is aimed at recognizing trainers that demonstrate a commitment to the American Quarter Horse in Canada through best training practices and leadership in promoting the importance of training fundamentals and horsemanship through AQHA and other national and/or provincial associations events.

HORSE AWARD

CQHA Performance Horse of the Year Award - This award is aimed at recognizing an outstanding Canadian bred or owned horse based on their accomplishments within a given year.

YOUTH AWARDS

CQHA/AQHA Youth of the Year - This award is aimed at recognizing CQHA/AQHA youth members that demonstrate a commitment to the American Quarter Horse in Canada through leadership in promoting the importance of sportsmanship and horsemanship) through AQHA and other national and/or provincial associations events. This award is aimed at recognizing youth already associated and engaged with AQHA.

CQHA Rising Star Award - This award is aimed at recognizing a youth that is not already involved with CQHA/AQHA but has demonstrated true worth as an up-and-coming horse professional and future industry leader.

INDUSTRY AWARD

CQHA/AQHA Development Leadership Award 0 This is aimed at recognizing an individual for their outstanding years of service to AQHA and the Canadian Quarter Horse industry. Nominations must include:

- Demonstrate involvement with the Canadian Quarter Horse industry, AQHA programs and initiatives. This may include but are not limited to contribution to AQHA directly, the AQHA provincial affiliate, or other associations that use American Quarter Horses like reining, cutting, reined cow horse, mounted shooting, and so on.
- This award can be awarded posthumously.

BREEDERS COMMITTEE

The Breeders Committee had a very productive year, meeting on an almost monthly bases. The committee welcomed CQHA members and directors to come together and have serious discussions about what is working and what isn't for our Canadian breeders. What was discovered, was that it did not matter if you are breeding race horses, ranch horses, or halter horses, the challenges of the market are all pretty consistent across the country and among all breeding niches.

The most impactful work of this committee was thanks to the efforts of the Media, Marketing & Communication's committee compiling Canadian bred results from major national and international competitions both AQHA and non AQHA. Seeing those results consistently being published on CQHA's social media streams has given both the committee and the Canadian Quarter Horse Community a visual account of the top quality horses that Canada produces. It is a testament to the talent, knowledge in husbandry, bloodlines, and genetics across all niches of equine sport that Canadian Quarter Horse breeders have acquired and utilize in their breeding decisions and practices. Quantifying our Canadian bred horses in this way, has been a bright spot in this year when we still faced a lot of uncertainty in the horse industry due to Covid, and has allowed the Breeders committee to connect with more breeders across Canada.

Much of the work of the committee in 2021, was about laying the foundation for projects that will come to fruition in 2022 and beyond; such as the CQHA.ca website's expanded capacity to offer CQHA members the opportunity to advertise their stallions in the Stallion Station, their breeding programs in the Breeder's directory, and to market their horses in the Canadian Quarter Horse Classifieds. Members will be able to manage their listings through the membership porthole, and promote their programs and horses both domestically and internationally as part of CQHA's Export Development initiatives.

While the Covid 19 pandemic forced this committee to put it's initial plans for an in-person Export Development mission to Europe or South America on hold for the time being, we want the CQHA membership to know that the initiative will be revisited as soon as international travel becomes more stable. In the meantime we are brainstorming ideas to work with these markets virtually.

During the lock down the committee members have been coordinating with Equestrian Canada to have the University of Guelph Equine Program prepare a study of the various breeders incentive programs, and futurity/maturity models that exist in the horse industry at large. It is hoped that a "While Paper" will be presented in 2022, which will allow us the analytic tools and perspective to draft a program that can compliment and contribute to Canadian based breeding programs.

GOVERNANCE COMMITTEE

The members of the 2021 Governance Committee (GC) were Kathy Patterson, Laurie Haughton, Wanda McFadyen, Michael Fuerth, Gilles Seguin and Wayne Burwash. Thank you to the entire committee for all their work with an extraordinary heavy agenda this year.

The major project for the Governance Committee this year was a complete review of our bylaws and governance process. It was the goal of the committee to have the new set of bylaws approved by the board of directors in time to be on the agenda for the 2021 AGM. However, this review and rewriting of the bylaws turned out to be a huge, complicated process and has resulted in the new bylaws not being approved on time to go out with the agenda. Therefore, CQHA BY-LAWS #5 will be presented at the AGM for discussion purposes only and placed on the agenda for a general meeting to be held during the Canadian AQHA Summit March 25-27.

As mentioned, the GC had a very busy year.In addition to the review of the bylaws, the GC agenda included:

- Drafting and approval of the Governance Committee Terms of Reference
- The review and approval of several of the other standing committees' terms of reference
- The drafting and approval of The Discipline, Complaints and Appeal Process Policy
- The review of Equestrian Canada's (EC's)major policy documents. Since the CQHA is an industry affiliate of Equestrian Canada, the GC sought board approval to use these policies as reference documents in situations where we did not have specific CQHA policy documents in place. Specific documents that will be referenced by the COHA include:
- EC Code of Conduct and Ethics
- EC Code of Conduct Conflict of Interest
- EC Abuse Policy
- EC Safe Sport Policy
- EC Concussion Policy
- EC Social Media Policy

With all these initiatives, the Governance Committee is setting the course for the CQHA to operate efficiently and successfully fulfill its mandate.



With the launch of CQHA's new website October 12, 2020, came the capacity to create an automated membership database.

Prior to this migration, the CQHA membership list first established in 2001 was stored in an excel spreadsheet. While the spreed sheet had been continually updated year after year, with an average of 72 new member being added annually, the information had not always been updated or verified, this was mainly due to the manual time consuming nature of the spread sheet

The excel based membership list was not able to be imported into a new database, this was because the email addresses were not recorded within it, and the database would require a user friendly unique filed like a member's email address to create an individual account for each member user.

Five hundred and six (506) CQHA member accounts have been created by Canadians since the launch of the new website with the membership database and member's login porthole.

Additionally the same system accounts for those who subscribe to the CQHA eNews list. Five hundred and thirty two (532) have done so since October 2020.

Within the CQHA membership area, members will soon be able to access and create listings in the Stallion Station, Breeders Directory, and Canadian Bred Classifieds.

This new system is flexible and has the ability to adapt to the needs of the association as it continues to grow and evolve.

NOMINATION AND CREDENTIAL COMMITTEE

The members of the Nomination and Credentials Committee (NCC) for 2021 were Andy Hellqvist, Brad Bowie, Gilles Seguin, Kathy Patterson, Laurie Haughton, Michael Fuerth and Wayne Burwash.

As a wrap-up from 2020, the election results from the voting by the members of the CQHA announced at the virtual annual general meeting (AGM) last November were as follows: elected for 3-year terms were Gayle Pawley-Wilson, Teagan Goodsell, Lyle Jackson and Brad Bowie; and elected for one-year terms were Kathy Patterson, Wanda McFadyen and Michael Fuerth.

The first order of business for the NCC this year was to draft: 1) the Terms of Reference for the NCC; and 2) the Nomination Criteria and Process for 2021. These documents were approved by the board and were placed on file.

As determined by the board of directors, the optimum number of elected directors is 18, with 1/3 (6 directors) to be elected each year for a 3-year term.

The 6 positions that are open for this year were created by the 3 directors who's 3-year terms are up in 2021 (Mary Robinson, Larry Clifford and Wayne Burwash) and, as noted above, the 3 directors that were elected for 1-year terms last year that have terms ending (Kathy, Wanda and Michael). Also, there are 2 one-year term positions created by resignation.

As approved by the board of directors at the October 6 meeting for the process of nominating and electing directors, the call for nominations/applications went out on October 10 and closed on October 31, open for a total of 3 weeks. The call for nominations was widely publicized, then based on nominations coming in, the NCC, on a personal bases, recruited candidates as required to fill regional representation and skill-set necessary to balance the board.

At the end of the nomination period, the NCC had only 6 complete and qualified applications/nominations. We received applications from 5 incumbents, Kathy Patterson, Michael Fuerth, Mary Robinson, Larry Clifford and Wayne Burwash. The other application was from Sandy Kirtzinger, a long-time breeder of Quarter Horses as well as active participant and volunteer in AQHA activities.

The NCC unanimously recommends to the CQHA board of directors and the general members to declare these 6 well qualified applicants elected by acclamation for 3-year terms as directors of the CQHA.

The NCC is continuing the search for other qualified candidates that could be recommended to the board of directors for consideration to fill, by appointment, the 2 one-year terms that are vacant.

The members of CQHA's newly established Officials and Professional Development Committee had a very productive inaugural year. The committee was established as a result of the Covid pandemic; with the boarder to the USA closed, all Canadian AQHA shows that were permitted to run in 2020 & 2021 had to rely on the few Canadian AQHA show officials to meet the demand. CQHA greatly appreciates the extraordinary effort our Canadian AQHA judges and show officials have made during the pandemic, however it brought to light just how few of them there are and how problematic that can be for our Canadian Quarter Horse Industry.

Having two new AQHA judges added to the roster this past year, was a great help to show managers and exhibitors this summer and fall. Both Lindsay Soderberg - Geiger and Jocelyn D'Entremont - McKenzie found themselves traveling the country to officiate, which helped to alleviate the stress on our industry.

The committee members focused much of their attention on communicating with Canadian trainers, coaches, and show managers, to find out how CQHA could work to assist and encourage more Canadians to pursue AQHA credentials. A survey to all Canada AQHA Pro Horsemen, Show Managers, and Judges has been prepared based on that feedback, and the industry wide survey is scheduled to be sent out in early 2022.

With the help of AQHA and the CQHA Grant Committee, we were lucky enough to secure AQHA Pro Horseman and industry leader Tara Gamble of Alberta, to create and

facilitate a Canadian focused virtual equine business seminar. This seminar was well attended and was even supported by the Saskatchewan Horse Federation, which encouraged and sponsored their certified coaches to take the CQHA/AQHA seminar. Feedback has been positive and the committee intends to run the seminar again in early 2022 with some additional online resources and group work/ support opportunities in the works.

There were eleven (11) Canadian AQHA Professional Horsemen on the ballot this fall for AQHA's Team Wrangle program membership vote: while no Canadian made the 2022 team. Mike Rapley of Ontario has been made an AQHA Professional Horseman Mentor, and has recently begun his application process to become an AQHA Open All Around Judge. This committee looks forward to working with and learning from him in 2022.

On behalf of CQHA we would like to congratulate all Canadians who enrolled in the AQHA University this past year, as well as to acknowledge Brad Bowie on obtaining his AQHA show management certification. There is much work ahead for this committee, but with dedicated industry leaders offering their assistance, and more Canadians reaching out to find out more about opportunities to acquire credentials the future is full of opportunity!

The YWC have decided to postpone the 2022 Youth World Cup and schedule the next Youth World Cup for 2023. It will be held in the USA, hopefully in Bryan College Station in Texas. The exact dates are being determined very soon. There are several reasons for this decision: The team selection requires a two-year qualification period. Several countries are still facing lock downs or restrictions on travel and competition, making qualification very difficult.

The USA is still restricting travel to the USA. Hopefully the borders will open making it impossible for teams to travel.

The cost and investment of the YWC is in excess of \$350 000. The Youth World Cup Committee doesn't feel comfortable committing that amount of investment when there could be a possibility of cancellation.

While the Virtual Youth World Cup was a huge success, they heard from participating YWC kids that they missed the interaction within the Teams. They are all aware that the YWC is more than just a competition! There is so much more to the YWC experience and they want to be able to give international kids the full experience.

YWC Committee will change the rules of the Youth World Cup to allow someone who is 19 on January 2023 to participate in the YWC. They are aware that a lot of kids will 'age out' in 2022, and they want to give them an opportunity to participate. It is for each individual team to decide their age limit, however and each country including Canada will have its own selection process and rules. The Youth World Cup Committee will be working with AQHA and Professional Horsemen to put together a series of YWC Clinics around the World in 2022.
