Purpose:


- Build readiness for AQHA's 2026 grant-based funding model

Timeline Overview

June 2025 – January 2026:

Task Force Mandate

- June: Framework approved by CQHA Board
- July: Task Force launched
- August-October: Surveys, interviews, feedback sessions
- November: Town Hall & analysis of insights
- December–January: Draft recommendations and toolkit
- January 2026: Final report presented to CQHA Board
- March 2026: Findings shared with AQHA Executive & International Committee
